About the Role

The Operations Support Traineeship is an entry point and pathway program for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

Our Operations Support Trainees provide frontline support to the Karratha Gas Plant Operations and Maintenance departments, and also work closely with the operators and technicians.

We provide you with on-the-job training, and an opportunity to develop your knowledge and understanding of the Woodside production processes.

Upon successful completion of the Operations Support Traineeship (2 years), participants can then progress to the Process Operator Traineeship.

The Operations Support Traineeship program has been running for more than 10 years, providing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders with the platform and opportunity to build their own great careers at Woodside.

Where will you be working?

You'll initially undertake classroom training at Woodside's Production Training Academy, based at Karratha Gas Plant. After the first two months, you will be assigned to an Operations shift team at one of the Woodside Burrup Production Facilities. This will involve on the job training and integration with Operations work groups to complete the remainder of the traineeship.

What are some of the day to day tasks and responsibilities?

- Participation in daily pre-start team meetings and toolbox meetings
- Preparation of berthing facilities prior to vessel arrivals following an established routine
- Carrying out routine inspections and testing activities under the direction of the operations staff
- Assisting Karratha Gas Plant operations with day to day tasks in the operational areas including oil additions and housekeeping activities
- Receiving and dispatching of goods and services
- Learning correct manual handling techniques.

What training will be provided?

Over the traineeship you will be provided with:

- Initial on-boarding and on-going technical training with Woodside's Production Training Academy
- Ongoing support from a dedicated Mentor/Advisor
- Regular training and assessment at North Regional TAFE, as you work towards successful completion of Certificate III in Supply Chain Operations
- Additional training in a variety of safety and trade related modules, including Forklift and First Aid.

What requirements are there to become a Operations Support Trainee?

There are no specific trade requirements, however applicants will need to demonstrate:

- Sound work history and demonstrated track record in their current career
- A strong willingness to learn
- A desire to further their career
- The ability to work in a team
- A preparedness to work shift work
- Ability to adapt to working 12 hour shifts under physically challenging conditions
- Ability to fulfil requirements to obtain a Maritime Security Identification Card.
- A current "C" class drivers licence, and ability to obtain a "HR" drivers licence.
- A good level of physical fitness and commitment to maintaining their health and wellbeing.
